V. New Business

- **a.** Revised Standing Rules (Malin)
 - a.i. The old standing rules were, to put it bluntly, awful. They were extremely messy and contradictive, and did not resemble how Senate actually operates
 - a.ii. Sent via email, and will be uploaded to the website—the old document is on the website so you can compare (and weep at the sadness that was the old Standing Rules)
 - a.iii. Requires 2/3 majority to adopt in the next 4 weeks. After that, it's a lot bigger majority so let's get this thing passed.
- **b.** First Read of resolution Prop B (Malin)

b.i. MONEY MONEY MONEY MONEY MONEY

- b.ii. Looking to undo the past 3 years of budget cuts—one of the only chances for the state/higher ed to increase revenue in the few years
- b.iii. Prop B is an increase on the tobacco tax (17 cent- last in the country) b.iii.1. The average is \$1.49
- b.iv. If it passes, it will add 73 cent to the tax (making new tax 90 cents, which is still below the average- 33rd in the US)
- b.v. 30% of the tax must go to higher education—meaning Truman would raise between \$105-\$120 million just for higher ed every single year
 b.v.1. This efficiently covers the \$100 million cut to higher ed over the past 3 years
- b.vi. 2 goals: registration drive, and creating a connection with the other public universities in the state (13) by making every school pass a joint resolution
- b.vii. Big tobacco companies are not getting involved on this initiative because they got a compromise worked out
- b.viii. The way the initiative is written will not allow the state to pull money from old programs (hopefully)
- c. First Read of resolution Voter Registration Drive (Malin)
 - c.i. Want to register 500 voters in the next month from voters
 - c.ii. 2 halves to the project: getting people to register, and getting them to vote in November
 - c.iii. Truman registration numbers are horrible
 - c.iv. We are going to present the cards and make it as simple as possible for students to register
 - c.v. Local elections are extremely important to Truman and having people voting with Truman in mind will be very helpful to Truman State University
 - c.vi. Mike- collaborate with other organizations who are also working on voter registration drives
 - c.vii. Laura- give free stuff away to get people's attention
 - c.viii. We want to stay as non partisan as possible
 - c.ix. Erin- make sure if we do, we should train the people who are participating in the drives in order to accurately transfer information

- c.x. Michael- making sure the registration cards get sent in
- c.xi. Nely- placing a specific number with a drive like this can be high risk but also provide good motivation. So if you're going to fully support it, make sure you are willing to go all in to make the number go up

- **a.** Voter Registration Drive Planning
 - a.i. Malin- has large involvement with registration drives and has some ideas:
 - a.i.1. Register people on the spot
 - a.i.2. Turn in the registration cards ourselves
 - a.i.3. Go to the students- sit on the quad, in the SUB, walk through the dorms, stand outside the dining halls to give cards out as people walk in and take them back as they leave
 - a.i.4. Pre-verify forms to make sure no information is missing, and if there is we can contact the students before turning the forms in
 - a.ii. Allison- going to the students is very important, but you should speak to ResLife first to avoid solicitation
 - a.iii. Laura- please don't violate any policies that is going to get you in trouble
 - a.iii.1. IT has started going through certain information that you can and can't send over email
 - a.iv. Erin- Go to org meetings and pass out voter reg cards
 - a.v. Stephen- Work with SAB—ie people who are going to events can fill stuff out there
 - a.vi. Laura- make sure people who are participating in the drive should be well versed in registering voters
 - a.vii. Katherine- if you have a table, have some music!
 - a.viii. Michael- if you contact SA's, you can go speak at their house meetings
 - a.ix. Malin- school is legally required to give students options to register to vote
 - a.x. Gordon- gallery- if you have comments you are more than welcome to speak
 - a.xi. Hannah- if you work a whole month, it might be a small group of people who would be stuck with a lot of work, so maybe focus on a "power week"
 - a.xii. Laura- make sure you remain non-partisan
 - a.xii.1. Malin- you will wear your student government nametags
 - a.xiii. Michael- if the body accepts Prop B, you can endorse the proposition while registering
 - a.xiv. Nely- Michael and Nely will take Grim; we may as well try to work with other groups on their drives to make sure everything is done right
 - a.xv. Hannah- if you are helping to correct other groups, keep it private

- a.xvi. Michael- at the very least, we should work with the heads of other organizations to track things in private
- a.xvii. Nely- either none or all of the political organizations or other student gruops should be involved
- a.xviii. Stephen- we should stay away from other political organizations; when we are being non-partisan we can put on polos and name tags, but by going out to work with orgs that are partisan would decrease the legitimacy of the drive
- a.xix. Jordan- not a good idea to work with partisan organizations, but because they are registering Truman Voters
- a.xx. Aaron- the implication of working with the orgs would be that you would be out on the quad, which wouldn't be as effective as working with ResLife specifically
- a.xxi. (Phillip)- you are more likely to get more voters because politicized parties will bring out people they already know, so by not being partisan you are able to reach a wider range of people
