- This past fall, President Paino allowed for a trial wet tailgating event prior to a home football game. Student Body President Ryan Nely organized a research committee to look into the long-term prospects of a permanent policy switch of lifting the ban on alcohol at tailgating events. After a month of research, and over 1300 generally positive responses in a survey sent to the student body, the committee presented a proposal to the Student Senate recommending this policy change to support wet tailgating. The resolution passed with unanimous consent and was sent to the Board of Governors for consideration. Now, the program is set to move forward in the fall!
- Truman at the Capitol is the school's annual lobbying initiative. This year on February 29th students from all majors and disciplines will be lobbying for the issues of continued funding to higher education and continued use of performance-based funding, which Truman benefits greatly from. It is a daylong event where students will meet with legislators from their home. Participating students will also get the opportunity to see Missouri's Congress in action by sitting in on legislative sessions. It will prove to be a unique, exciting, and resume-building experience for the participants with the added benefit of providing a service for Truman State University.
