STUDENT GOVERNMENT GENERAL MEETING 12 February 2017

 - i Address from President Sue Thomas
 - MO constitution calls for balanced budget, projections for revenue growth were not met
 - Gov. Greitens cut \$146 Million 8% withhold from public higher ed institutions--accounted \$80 million of 146
 - a Withheld Greenwood money
 - Trying to come up with #3.144 million
 - Looking at central money such as transportation, utility savings
 - Academic Affairs has 75%-80% of budget, also looking to cut centrally
 - Still missing \$300,000; looking into operating budgets
 - Statute 389: caps tuition increases at CPI (.7% right now)
 - a 4 options to increasing tuition: do nothing, increase by .7% (\$50) and book it and then not charge it (for next year), surcharge of \$50 (paid by everyone, including those with full-tuition scholarships), book and wave .7% AND charge surcharge this year
 - Board chose last option: raising tuition by \$50 next year and charging \$50 this year to everyone (on full-time students only)
 - c Grants will be available for the surcharge for any with extreme financial need
 - d This will bring in \$250,000, only 8% of total withhold
 - e Second tuition increase in past 5 years
 - NYT study of income found that median family income of Truman students is \$104,000
 - a This is a doable surcharge according to this stat
 - University needs to protect reserve funds--untouchable; Truman is self-insured
 - Truman will never begin deficit spending
 - Email will be sent out tomorrow to student body and surcharge will be added on to student bill
 - Fiscal year begins July 1: Gov. Greitens recommended 9% cut to state education
 - a 9% is just over \$4
 - b 19% of payroll (\$750,000) goes to retirement funds
 - c In all, cut of \$5 million
 - 1 year approach: VP's looking across lines to find cuts
 - a Constituent will be put together to decide how to handle this in the future
 - b This won't be the last budget cut the university sees in the near future
 - CPI next year is 2.1% (\$750,000 for Truman)
 - COFE (Presidents and Chancellors of MO Universities) will be raising tuition by the same amount
 - a Will be charging per credit hour so percentage will be different across the state of MO
 - b \$20 per credit hour is the absolute maximum (not confirmed)

- c 2.1% tuition increase next year (low-end guess), max would be 8% (the \$20 per credit increase--%2.5-2.7 million, only about half of cut)
- Capital campaign going well, most money going towards scholarships
- Housing on campus will not go up next year
