 - 1. The Arts & Humanities Perspective did not pass, mainly because the STEM Perspective has not gone through Faculty Senate, so they wanted to wait and see.

Discussion

- a. TEDx Conference
 - i. Leppanen: we were under the impression there was a consensus on continuing TEDx, apparently there is not. Because of how previously decided the process of establishing and renewing ad hoc committees, we never had a formal discussion on the committee's existence. That discussion does not have to happen, but we will have one now.
 - ii. Leppanen: TEDx either happens or it does not. We have three options: one, we don't have it; two, we have it next year, with speaker and committee applications live now; and third, committee applications this semester and speaker applications next semester. The third is what Katie did last year, the second is what we plan to do.
 - iii. Montúfar: I feel that the majority of the body does want to do it. As Katie has said, it would be a lot easier on everyone involved to select speakers this semester.
 - iv. Alexander: If someone doesn't believe TEDx should happen, I would hope they voice their concerns now. I think the event brought the campus together, and was great publicity for the University and Student Government. It was a unifying experience, with professors and students sharing their ideas in the same space. I don't think that can be replicated any other way, because the name lends its weight. We had over fifty applications among professors and students. I think it would be a great loss to not have it again. We have to get started early, because of the time crunch. I don't want Shania to have to deal with the stress I had.
 - v. Holt: I don't think we are concerned with the event happening, it was great for Hannah and everyone involved. What is a concern is how it will fit into the budget.
 - vi. Leppanen: On the budget: we've been burning through our rollover, and with enrollment declining, our budget is going to be the smallest it's ever been. There are things we can do to make it grow, we are not confined to lobbying for fee changes only during OAF years.
 - vii. Hogan: Deanna has been asking for a month for people interested in being chair, if there were any concerns with the conference, they should have been brought up sooner. Shania's appointment was not in my mind the time to discuss those concerns.
 - viii. Wissler: This event is truly invaluable. For the people that did it, it was amazing and stands out on a résumé. Yes, money is an issue, but it's always going to be, and I think it's an issue of allocation, not total amount. Some supplies we will probably not have to pay for again, so that will help.
 - ix. Barker: Student Government has three purposes: putting on events, public policy, and appropriation. TEDx is an event fully embodies the liberal arts ideal of Truman, and I think it is the best possible event SG can do right now.
 - x. Kolok: Is there a definite number for the total cost?
 - 1. Alexander: Last year it was \$1400, with a \$250 sponsorship from SAB.
 - 2. Hogan: theoretically, we would not have to spend almost \$400 on supplies. There are other costs that could be trimmed. Women's Leadership Conference will need less money, as well as Student Appreciation Week.
 - 3. Alexander: Without the supplies we already have, it would be \$1166.
 - xi. Schmidt: Is cost truly the only concern?
 - xii. Holt: No, I wonder whether the effort from putting it on two years in a row could create burnout.
 - xiii. Schmidt: From what I gathered, there some licensing things that we don't have to renew until next year, so we may end up doing it biannually, but we don't know how consecutive

events will go until we try it. FWIW, you can always come to us with concerns. I'm sorry that people felt like it got pushed through.

xiv. Leppanen: Truth be told, we don't always do the best job communicating everything that's going on. We'll try our best to make sure everyone is in the loop. Discussion is healthy!
