- a) Treasurer

 - c) The President and Vice President of the Student Association
 - i) We are asking all of the chairs to reach out to the associates and invite them to run for a voting senator position.
 - ii) We want to focus a lot on policy right now. There's plenty of time with 5 meetings left.
 - iii) End of the year reports will be coming up, and we will need them done before the transition meeting.
 - iv) We have 17 Google Form responses which we went through; most of them are not totally serious or are asking about questions that have already been answered. We will be continuing to send it in all-school emails and monitoring that, and if something significant comes up we will direct it.
 - v) We want discussion on the conference in the Fall, since we are struggling. We feel that there is a difference of opinion on what the resolution is saying. We are not sure if this administration was supposed to appoint the committee/chair since that leaves no leeway

for the next administration. We think it might be smarter to move programming weeks from the Spring to the Fall, and then move the conference to the Spring.

- (1) E.Smith: I think that would be great, assuming that no Freshmen chairs are in charge of the programming weeks. I think there's a learning curve and in the first semester of college would be a real challenge for new students.
- (2) Rollings: In terms of Emily's point, I completely agree. I think it would be very stressful for those students. What was the original idea behind necessarily having a full week of programming? Maybe we switch them to just a day.
- (3) White: I like the idea of some events moving to the Fall. I think Student Appreciation week should stay in the Spring. Also I know it might be difficult to plan events for the first time, but maybe they can do a day event to start the learning curve and then do a weekly programming later in the Fall.
- (4) Holt: I think it would be really important for current chairs to write extremely thorough end of the year reports to help those chairs next year - such as contact information, scheduling, etc. We could also look back at doing Bulldog Days again, which each committee has a day in the week.
- (5) E.Smith: Potentially having more structure for new chairs might be helpful. Maybe having an old committee member start in the first two meetings to guide them along. I didn't know the right questions to ask, and having someone to help walk me through it was extremely helpful.
- (6) Montufar: My concern isn't having people do something I haven't done before, my bigger concern is that it might limit the work that can be put into the programming.
