 - i) Last week I had several students reach out to me and ask on how to drop out of the semester.
 - (1) Discussion:
 - (a) Schmidt: Laura has been in meetings all day, so she will get back to you ASAP. One thing we talked about was prompting students for more specifics on what Truman could have been providing that could help.
 - (i) Meyer: For the most part, students just seemed to have had a lot on their plate.
 - (ii) Schmidt: Another thing we talked about was advertising what changes have already been made as well as some of the services we do offer. Some things some students don't know about are the pass/fail policy.
 - (iii) Montúfar: I think it would be a good idea to centralize all of our tips and information for students.
 - (iv) Rollings: Every department has a different policy when it constitutes pass/fail, but I haven't heard anything from the econ. department myself. Maybe we send something that prompts departments to reach out to their students.

 - g) Diversity Committee
 - i) We first read the land acknowledgment resolution and we are hoping to finish that up this weekend.
 - ii) The resolution we would like to first read is earmarking Diversity Week for next Fall. It currently suggests using materials we had already ordered and allocating money to posters and a Unity Dinner. We are thinking around \$1000, should we be more vague?
 - (1) Discussion:
 - (a) Holt: I think writing a resolution explicitly stating deadlines would be good. For setting aside money, we will have a lot of rollover and while next year's budget will be smaller, that \$1000 for one big event wouldn't be totally unreasonable.
 - (b) Schmidt: I would specify how many people rsvp'd to the Unity Dinner to show their interest in it.

I think if that's the case, then you should share examples of professors who are doing things correctly. If you just say professors should be aware of mental wellness, it might not be specific enough.
 - (b) Alexander: I was wondering if you can order your resolution more? I got a little lost within it due to information overload.
 - (c) White: I wanted an idea of where you were going with the attendance policy. I wasn't too happy about professors having the ability to create their own attendance policy until I had Dr. Rickell. Maybe talk to her about her policy.
 - (d) Meyer: I do think this is an important statement, especially if there's a strict attendance policy. If attendance sheets are passed around, and I'm already having a bad mental health day, then it's a question of what are we placing more value on.
 - (e) Holt: I think that even if this doesn't suggest a policy change, right now it's important to document the student opinion as a body.
 - (f) Alexander: We paid thousands of dollars for the classes and we should be able to decide if we attend or not.
 - (g) Rollings: We should not be encouraging students to put off their well being. Some professors are not receptive.
 - (h) Barker : I can add more specific examples. It can be difficult to reach out in times of stress.
