Projects

This committee was involved in the continuous fulfillment of the non-academic aspects of the University community. This committee also encourages updates/improvisations deemed necessary from the perspective of the Student Association.

Updated Academic Building Maps

Status: Completed/Ongoing

Description: At the beginning of the school year, the Student Affairs Committee discovered that many students were unaware of the resources available within each academic building. It was also found out that none of the academic building maps were on the Truman State University website. In response to that concern, the members of this committee went through each academic building and located all of the water bottle filling stations, gender neutral and accessible bathrooms, computer stations, and accessible printers. All of those resources were then added to the maps of each academic building. To ensure that students were made aware of the available resources, Jesse Wren was able to meet with Deanna Rood, and Web Writer and Editor for the TSU website. From there, I was able to share the updated maps with her and she added each to the website. Kiren MacLeod and I also met with Sam Guth and Kenny McKim from Physical Plant about updating the physical maps within each building. Though we were unable to replace the maps in the academic buildings this semester, Physical Plant is capable of updating each of the maps. We also made a resolution outlining the services in each academic building.

Picnic Tables on the Quad

Status: Ongoing

Description: One of the first talked about projects for this committee was placing picnic tables on the quad. Laura Bates brought up the website, MaxR, for the picnic tables as that being where Student Government had gotten recycling bins previously. MaxR has reliable picnic tables, but seeing the prices, the committee thought it would be best to find other clubs and organizations to help sponsor the tables. After much research and a lot of communication with Lori Shook, I as the chair was able to meet with Laura Bates and Lori Shook for a specific location on the quad that would best fit the placement of picnic tables. Unfortunately, due to non-essential spending being put on hold by the governor, this project had to be put on hold.

Student Appreciation Week

Date: Planned for March 30-April 3

Location: SUB Georgian Rooms, SUB Down Under, and Quad

Description: This is an annual event that this committee puts on. Although this week was unable to happen this year, a lot of great ideas were thought up for this week. On Monday, March 30, we had planned on having a self-care event held in the SUB Down Under. We had paired with the Health, Wellness, and Safety Committee to include coloring sheets, facial masks, journaling, snacks, yoga, and a mindfulness event with Dr. Eric Dickson. Because the week was unable to occur, the Health, Wellness, and Safety Committee added this specific event to the list of events they would like to be moved to Fall Semester of 2020, still working with this committee for the event. As for Tuesday, we had planned on tabling with Sarah Mitchell, a local citizen who makes kettle corn. On Wednesday, we had planned on buying muffins and donuts from sodexo for tabling in the morning.
