 - i) Purinton: I met with Jonathan Vieker and he suggested that we look at similar schools to Truman as far as changing the add/drop week. He mentioned that when Truman did this before, Truman changed the withdrawal date from ten weeks to twelve weeks.
 - ii) Purinton: He does not think that it will take 3 years to implement and he also does not think that I'll have to rework the entire academic calendar. He thinks an extension of the drop deadline is good, but he thought that extending the add deadline would create stress for students joining classes so late. So, instead, he suggested a focus on second block classes, but to do that we would need to increase the classes that fulfill the Liberal Arts requirements that Truman has.
