5) New Business

- **a)** Appropriations Slates
 - i) <u>Blue Key</u> (Meyer)
 - (1) Meyer: Like Jesse said, he is a member of this organization so I am bringing it to the table. He did not write the application and while we were discussing this, Jesse was not involved and he did not influence the decisions in any way.
 - (2) Meyer: Blue Key requested \$650 to go to Kansas City for a Leadership Conference, which would cover the registration fee. The committee decided to approve this because it would be a good look for Truman and because several members were invited to the conference to receive awards.
 - (3) Montúfar: Have they generally requested funding for this?
 - (a) Meyer: I don't think they have in the past because the conferences are usually farther away and thus something that they've never considered.
 - (b) Bates: I don't remember ever funding Blue Key in the past.
 - (4) Approved.
 - ii) Film Club (Wren)
 - (1) Wren: The film club also requested \$650 to be able to host larger events. We have decided to not recommend any money to them at this time; we want them to come back with another application that gives us more specific information on what they want to do.

- (2) Hamill: I was talking to Robbie about this and he was frustrated that he couldn't plan an event without knowing his budget.
- (3) Meyer: Point of clarification, the point of appropriations is to fund specific events, so the organization needs to come to us with a plan.
- (4) Montúfar: If they plan to resubmit an application, do they work with you or do they just keep trying?
 - (a) Wren: I would be happy to work with them, but they can submit as many applications as they want.
- (5) Rascher: I would suggest changing the language of what you're sending back to the film club... instead of saying "we would like to see...", say that "we *need* to see..."
- (6) Bates: The point is not to send people to a bunch of places, but to increase activity on campus.

- iii) Namaste Nepal (Wren)
 - (1) Wren: Namaste Nepal has asked for \$650 to fund an event in November. We have decided to recommend the full \$650 at this time. We think it's a great opportunity to share Nepal's culture and food with our Truman Community.
 - (2) PJ: What exactly is the celebration?
 - (a) Chebolu: It is a major celebration from back home.
 - (b) Karki: It is one of the biggest festivals of the Hindu religion. It's also where we are celebrating our culture by making it a public event so that we can share our food and culture with the campus.
 - (3) Carey: What is the significance of \$650?
 - (a) Smith: That is the maximum that organizations can request.
 - (4) Myers: I think their math might be wrong; it adds up to \$700.
 - (a) Wren: I did not add up the numbers so I apologize for that, but they will not be getting more than \$650 because that is all we can give them.
 - (5) Approved.

 - i) Bono: This was a big thing that I wanted to accomplish for Purple Friday. I wanted to get a new item that we could give out since we've been giving out the same stuff all semester. Feel free to come to my committee meeting where we will be discussing the design before I purchase these.
